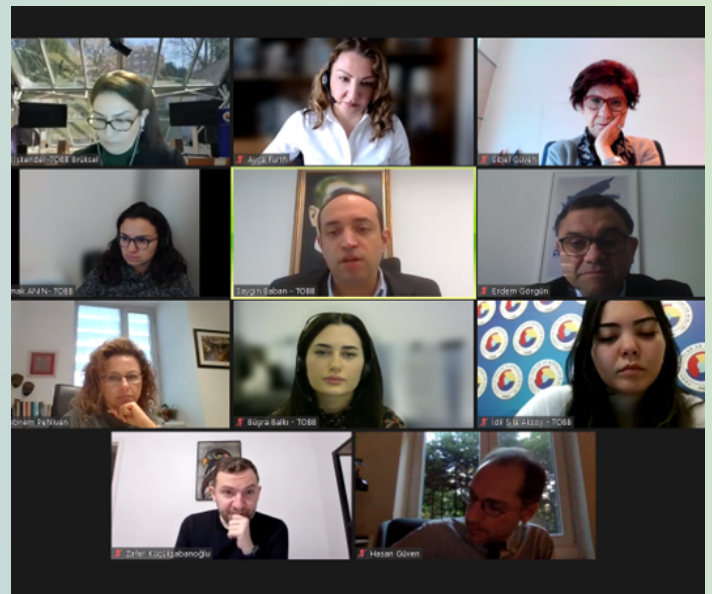

Focus Group Meeting

A focus group of Türkiye representing different stakeholders gathered on 21 November, moderated by TOBB representatives. Experts from higher education, research institutions, vocational education, NGOs and company representatives from digital and green sectors, reviewed the current training methodologies and discussed skills mismatches between education, training and labour market to reach the green and digital transition. The focus group revealed that SMEs are more advanced and aware of digital skills compare to green skills.
